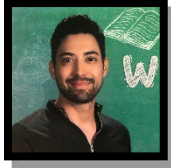

Incumbent

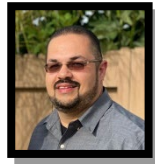
Greetings Fellow FTA Members, I once again come before you and ask for you to consider me for a Director at Large position.

Incumbent

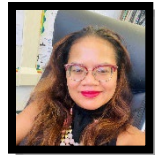
